SALE RULES

1. **Entries are due December 5, 2009** with signed registration certificates plus \$60.00 per head entry fee. Send entries to James Danekas & Associates, Inc., 9960 Business Park Drive, Ste. 170, Sacramento, CA. 95827. No bull will be cataloged without the \$60.00 entry fee. **Entry fees which are postmarked after December 5, 2009 will incur a \$50.00 additional charge per lot entered.**
2. Only bulls calved between February 13, 2007 and March 31, 2009 are eligible for the sale. (no exceptions will be made for age.) All bulls must be AMF and/or NHF by pedigree or test.
3. The 2010 sale will be divided into three categories as follows:
 - A. Fitted bulls-growth bulls**

Bulls in this category must be halter broke and shown individually. Each individual animal must be tied in the stall with a good rope halter and this halter must go with the animal to the buyer. Bulls must be tied with a neck rope and this rope must be left on the bull until the bull is loaded out of the sale barn. If the consignor fails to comply with this rule, a neck rope will be purchased and same charged to the consignor. Nose leads must be used at all times when moving bulls. A Champion and Reserve Champion will be selected in this division.
 - B. Pens of two (yearlings and 2-year-olds)**

Bulls in this category will be judged as a pen of two. The bulls must be clean, but it is not necessary to fit them. Bulls must be halter broke. Clipping is at the option of the consignor. Trophies will be awarded to the Champion and Reserve Champion pens.
 - C. Low birth EPD-calving ease**

Low birth EPD/calving ease section. To be eligible for this section, your bull must have an official performance pedigree with complete individual EPDs from the American Angus Association. The maximum birth EPD for this section is a +2.0 lbs. The maximum raw birth data cannot exceed 80 lbs. Both the sire and the dam must have a birth EPD of +2.5 lbs or less to qualify for this division. Bulls in this division will only compete with bulls within this division. A Champion and a Reserve Champion will be selected. Bulls must be halter broke and shown in their respective class. Bulls who qualify as low birth EPD/calving ease bulls, but who do not have official American Angus Association EPD data, are not eligible for this section. You may enter your low birth EPD/calving ease bull in the growth section if you so desire. No bull can be entered in more than one division. Once entered in a division, he must stay in that division. The Fall 2009 EPD information will be the data used for this classification.
4. Sale costs will be pro-rated. 1% commission to the Idaho Angus Association; 5% commission to James Danekas & Associates, Inc; 1% to the Auctioneer. Plus, any charges directly responsible to each consignment (i.e.-band inspection, beef council, transfer fees etc).
5. All bulls must be semen tested within 30 days prior to the sale and an individual certificate of fertility for each bull provided. Bulls must be semen tested prior to 2-12-2010.

6. Health requirements:

- A. All bulls, **including virgin bulls**, must have a negative trich test completed within 30 days prior to the sale. No bulls will sell without a trich test and all bulls must have an official State of Idaho trich tag. Out of state cattle can obtain tags from your vet or the sale vet can provide tags at the sale site. If and only, if you have the proper trich test papers.
 - B. All bulls must have a negative blood test for bangs completed within 30 days prior to the sale.
 - C. Cattle coming from other than a certified or modified free tuberculosis area should have a negative intradermis tuberculin test conducted by an accredited laboratory within 30 days prior to the sale date to eliminate any problems in shipping to certain states.
 - D. All cattle require individual health papers.
 - E. Consignors should check with their particular State Veterinary Office for possible variations in tests pertinent to their specific area concerning entry into the State of Idaho and possible entry into other states to which cattle may sell.
7. Animals must be eligible to pass necessary tests to enter any state they may sell to, or the seller still owns them. Seller will maintain the animal, make necessary tests at his cost, and assist in arranging shipping on animals sold to the states needing additional tests.
 8. Cattle will be placed in classes by the show judge. Cattle will be examined by a judge and sifting committee for quality and soundness. Undesirable and unsound cattle will be sifted - and sifted cattle must be removed by the consignor. No sifted bulls will be sold on the premise during the sale.
 9. The sale order will be set by the Sale Committee and Sale Manager based upon placing made by the Judge and Grading Committee.
 10. Consignors having no sales must pay pro-rated sale costs and commissions.
 11. Entry fee is forfeited in the event cattle are not sold due to sifting or not showing up.
 12. Substitutes will be allowed, if legitimate (death/injury).
 13. No added entries will be allowed after the catalog goes to press.
 14. First time consignors from states other than the adjoining States of Idaho are limited to 2 bull entries. Consignors must be members of the Idaho Angus Association. Memberships will be accepted at any time and dues will be deducted from proceeds of anyone who is not currently a member of the association.
 15. **Consignors will have their trucks available by sale day to assist with delivery.**
 16. **Consignors must check with the Sale Management before leaving the sale site for possible cattle to be hauled to the consignor's general areas.**
 17. Please include any performance information on your entries so it can be incorporated into the footnotes. If you are enrolled in the AHIR program, indicate so with your entries. We will use the emblem under each lot number in the catalog and indicate to the buyers to check with the consignors for the records.
 18. The sale may take up to 30 working days to close. Sellers must be aware of the time to collect proceeds, clear checks and pay the bills. Only after all the bills are received can the sale be closed. Proceeds will be sent to consignors only after all consignor's paperwork has been completed and all proceeds have been collected from the purchaser. All sales and guarantees are between buyer and seller.

Sale Rules

1. **Entries are due no later than December 5, 2009** with \$60.00 entry fee per lot. Send all entries to: James Danekas & Associate, Inc., 9960 Business Park Drive, Ste. 170, Sacramento, CA 95827
2. The individual entry fees must be submitted at the time of entry. **Entries postmarked after December 5, 2009 will incur an additional \$50.00 fee per lot entered.**
3. Consignors must be members of the Idaho Angus Association. Memberships will be accepted at any time, and membership dues will be deducted from the proceeds of any consignor who is not currently a member of the association.
4. **Sale expenses will be calculated as follows:**
 - a. Pro-rated sale expenses (building rental, catalog, sale day labor, advertising, etc.)
 - b. 1% commission to the Idaho Angus Association.
 - c. 5% commission to James Danekas & Associates, Inc.
 - d. 1% commission to the Auctioneer.
 - e. Expenses charged directly to consignor (brand inspections, transfers, registration, vet., etc.).
 - f. \$20 per head the Gem State Heifer Classic premium fund.
5. Consignors are urged to offer services and rebreeding privileges on all consignments.
6. Cattle will be placed in classes by the show judge. All cattle will be sifted at the sale for soundness. (lameness, pinkeye, excessive ringworm, warts, etc.). Undesirable and unsound cattle will be sifted. No sifted females will be sold on the premises during the sale.
7. Heifers over 24 months-of-age must sell safe in calf or with a calf at side. Females with a calf over 4 months of age at side must be rebred.
8. All females over 24 months of age must have their pregnancy status verified by an accredited veterinarian within 30 days prior to the sale, and this information must be in the hands of the sale manager by 9:00 a.m. February 12, 2010 or be subject to examination at the sale site at the owner's expense.
9. Individual health papers are required on each animal selling. All cattle over 24 months-of-age must have a negative brucellosis test conducted by an accredited veterinarian within 30 days of the sale. All females over 4 months-of-age must be calfhood vaccinated with a legible bangs tattoo. This information must be indicated on their individual health papers. Negative tuberculosis tests are required on all animals not originating in t.b. Accredited herds or modified T.B. free areas.

10. Animals must be eligible to pass necessary tests to enter any state they may sell to, or the seller still owns them. Seller will maintain the animal, make necessary test at his cost, and assist in arranging shipping on animals sold to the states needing additional tests.
11. Entry fee is forfeited in the event of sifting and on cattle that do not arrive at the sale.
12. Entries may be accepted after the deadline, however additional entry fees are required and no substitutes will be accepted after the catalog is printed.
13. Consignors having no/sales will pay all pro-rated sale costs and commissions at the price announced by the auctioneer.
14. All consignors are subject to the terms and conditions of sale printed in the catalog.
15. It is required that calves and bred heifers be halter broken. All other entries can be displayed loose in pens. All entries to be fitted and presented in a professional manner prior to arrival at the sale site. Touch-up clipping and fitting can be done in the blocking chutes in designated areas of the barn. Each consignor will be responsible for preparing his own cattle for the sale ring.
16. Consignors will assist in the delivery of sale cattle at the buyer's risk. No consignor may leave the sale site until shipping arrangements on his consignments are confirmed with the sale manager or his representative. Violation of this rule could result in disqualification from future participation in the sale.
17. The sale may take up to 30 working days to close. Sellers must be aware of the time to collect proceeds, clear checks and pay the bills. Only after all the bills are received can the sale be closed. Proceeds will be sent to consignors only after all consignor's paperwork has been completed and all proceeds have been collected from the purchaser. All sales and guarantees are between buyer and seller.
18. All entries must be AMF and/or NHF by pedigree or test.

Sale Rules

1. Entries must be born in 2009 and must have a minimum weight of 650 lbs with 2 divisions:
 - A. Purebred Angus Steers (**eligible for registration**)
 - B. All other Crossbreds (**must be at least 50% Angus**)
2. A \$15.00 entry fee for Steers to go to the Idaho Angus Association.
3. Sale costs will be 1/2 of the pro-rated sale costs for the bulls plus a 2.5% commission to the Sale Management, 1/2% to the Auctioneer and 1/2% to the Idaho Angus Association.
4. All Jackpot Steer Consignors must be member of the Idaho Angus Association or Idaho Junior Angus Association.
5. All Steers must be halter broke and shown in order to be eligible to be sold. All Steers must sell.
6. The Steers will be placed in class to establish sale order.
7. All Steers must have a health statement that accompanies them to the sale.
8. Entries are due by December 5, 2009
