58th WESTERN NATIONAL ANGUS FUTURITY TO ALL W.N.A.F. EXHIBITORS

PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS: All animals to be exhibited must be accompanied by an official Health Certificate prepared by an approved veterinarian. BLANKET HEALTH PERMIT # FOR THE 2010 WNAF IS AB121-109-7271. Please have veterinarian use this number when writing health papers. A copy of the Nevada Health Requirements is enclosed. No cattle may be exhibited without appropriate health papers!!

TRUCKING, BRAND INSPECTION PAPERS:

1. The following trucking regulations are in effect in Nevada: Farm vehicles are exempt from carrier licensing and also the transportation of livestock by the owner thereof on his own single unit truck of 10,000 lbs. or less unladen weight. If the above mentioned vehicles are diesel powered, it will be necessary to purchase a 48 hour temporary fuel license. Units weighing over 10,000 lbs., and any units hauling for hire, will need 48 hour temporary licenses and registrations. It will be necessary for drivers to obtain licenses at the first available vendor upon entering the state of Nevada.
2. All animals from states other than Nevada must be accompanied by brand inspection papers! Nevada cattle must have a transportation slip.

RENO LIVESTOCK EVENTS CENTER, SHOW AND SALE HEADQUARTERS:

1. NO CATTLE will be allowed onto the ground prior to 8:00 a.m. on Wednesday, April 21, 2010. No stalls or tie outs are available prior to that time. All cattle will be stalled in the arena of the Main Arena. Stall assignments will be given to you by the show manager upon your arrival. Cattle arriving after 6:00 p.m. will go to assigned tie outs behind the main arena and stalls will be assigned the following day. Questions should be directed to Jim Danekas, Show Manager at 916/837-1432.
2. Tie outs will be assigned. Exhibitors are responsible for bedding. Straw may be purchased from Feed World 775/323-1533. Pens will be occupied by cow/calf pairs only and a limited number will be available. Transit cattle allowed in tie out if space permits. Transit cattle will be charged the following: \$30/day if the management is notified prior to arrival and \$50/day if the management is not notified prior to arrival.
3. Stall fees will be deducted from premiums. Bedding will be provided and the cost of this will be deducted from the premium pool. All cattle are required to be in stalls by 9:00 am each show day to allow spectators to view entries prior to the show.

WESTERN NATIONAL ANGUS FUTURITY RULES

ELIGIBILITY TO SHOW:

New Reno Livestock Event Center Rules

- **Absolutely No Alcohol on the grounds or in the RLEC main arena. This rule must be adhered to the letter. Violators are subject to being banned and removed from the site by the RLEC.**
- **Food is only allowed in the RLEC prior to the beginning of the show on Saturday, April 24. After the show begins on April 24 no food is allowed to be brought into the RLEC. Food and beverage, including alcohol will be available at the concession stand.**
- **These food and alcohol rules are RLEC regulations not WNAF regulations, and MUST BE ADHERED to by all participants. No alcohol will be serve in the RLEC on Junior Day, April 24, 2010. The WNAF asks that these new RLEC regulation be honored by all WNAF and Western Regional Junior Show participants.**
- All cattle you plan to exhibit in the 2010 W.N.A.F. must be listed on the proper show entry forms with fully completed information and submitted along with proper entry fees of \$50 per entry and postmarked on or before March 15, 2010. Entries received postmarked after March 15, 2010 and no later than March 22, 2010 will be accepted with an entry fee of \$250 per entry. Additional entry fee must be postmarked no later than March 22, 2010 to be eligible. Any entries received postmarked after March 23, 2010 will not be accepted under any circumstances.
- Substitutes will not be accepted after March 22, 2010. Entries received without all entry fees included will be mailed immediately back to the exhibitor. No entries accepted without entry fees accompanying entries.
- All cattle must be in place and have registration papers and tattoos checked by 2:00 p.m. on Friday, April 23rd. Cattle will be released upon completion of the bull show on Monday. Those leaving prior to this time will forfeit premium money. Junior show only cattle are allowed to leave after they have shown.
- All cattle entered must be duly recorded in the herd books of the American Angus Association. In the case of Canadian entries, the entries must be recorded, or eligible to be recorded in the American Angus Association Herdbooks. Original registration certificate must be available for checking at the show. A photocopy of the original is not acceptable.
- Exhibitors must have the ORIGINAL registration certificate on each animal available for inspection at the show. Electronically stored registration certificates are NOT accepted - only the original certificates issued by the American Angus Association. Any animal, upon check-in, which does not have a legible permanent identification mark (ear tattoo marks, freeze-branded marks or hot-branded marks) corresponding to the permanent identification mark on the registration certificate, is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible permanent identification mark, animals cannot be re-tattooed and re-checked at the show. If you have a tattoo problem, contact the American Angus Association at 816/383-5100 PRIOR to arriving the show.
- Calves that accompany their dams into the show ring (individual and cow/calf classes) must be tattooed and have a registration certificate available for checking.
- Any female shown with a calf at side, the calf must be her most recent natural calf and be registered.
- Only one person at a time shall lead animals into the show ring.
- Exhibitors who participate in shows that accept premium monies contributed by the American Angus Association are subject to the Association Rules as found in the Breeders Reference Guide of the Association. These rules are found in Part 2; Association Rules. The rules relating directly with the exhibition of Angus cattle are Part 2: Association Rules; Rule 800 Series; including Rule 800 - 811. These rules can be found at www.angus.org.
- Any product administered internally or used externally to alter the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair), use of graphite, powders, hemp or other similar substances externally and steroids, growth stimulants or artificial filling internally. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing. The exhibition of cattle displaying false hair will not be allowed, with the exception of false tail switches.

- o At any show for which the American Angus Association appropriates funds toward the payment of premiums, no exhibitors, individuals assisting exhibitors or member owners at such show shall be allowed to use any coloring agents, on any animal exhibited. The Association may adopt and implement various tests designed to monitor this prohibition, including but not limited to a "white towel" or "white glove" test. No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in designated make up areas.
- o All animals exhibited are subject to DNA marker or blood type test to verify accuracy of parentage as covered under the Association Rules and for other testing as required by the individual show.
- o Authorized representatives of the Association have the authority to enforce the rules set forth herein as well as in the Association Rules, including the barring of a registered animal from a livestock show at which it is to be shown, if there are reasonable grounds to believe a violation has occurred.

FEMALE & BULL CLASSES (Entry fee \$50.00 per entry): Age Classification - Bulls born between January 1, 2007 and October 31, 2009. Females born between September 1, 2007 and October 31, 2009.

COW/CALF CLASSES (Entry fee \$50.00 entry): Cow, born before September 1, 2007 with natural calf at side born after July 20, 2009. (Only females that have no individual class available are eligible for this division).

In these cow/calf classes judging points will be based on 60% on the cow and 40% on the calf. Champions in this division will not be eligible to compete for Grand Champion female of the open show. Likewise females from cow/calf classes cannot compete in any of the group classes.

GROUP CLASSES (Entry fee \$50.00 per entry): All animals shown in group classes must have been exhibited in the individual classes. Each showman in the group classes must wear the number of the animal as exhibited in the individual classes and the heeler must wear the group's entry number. LATE ENTRIES WILL NOT be accepted at the show!

GET OF SIRE: Four animals by one sire, both sexes represented.

JUNIOR GET OF SIRE: Three animals by one sire, both sexes represented. Entries must have been calved between May 1, 2008 and October 31, 2009.

BREEDERS BEST SIX HEAD: The exhibitor of the breeders six head must be breeder and first owner, identified by the same member code for the animals exhibited. Cattle owned by other exhibitors may be included provided the exhibitor of the breeders six head is the breeder and first owner of the included animal(s). Animals must be exhibited in individual classes. Cattle bred and owned by a junior member(s) may be included if the exhibitor of the breeders six head is an individual or married couple and is the parent or legal guardian of the junior member(s).

PRODUCE OF DAM: Two head produced by the same dam.

PREMIUMS: Premiums will be paid from the "2010 W.N.A.F. Premium Pool". This pool is calculated after 2010 expenses are deducted from the 2010 income.

ENTRY DEADLINE - MARCH 15, 2010

ENTRIES POSTMARKED BETWEEN MARCH 16, 2010 AND MARCH 22, 2010 WILL BE ACCEPTED AT AN ENTRY FEE OF \$250 PER ENTRY. ENTRY FEE MONEY FOR THE LATE ENTRY PERIOD MUST BE POSTMARKED NO LATER THAN MARCH 22, 2010. NO EXCEPTIONS.

SUBSTITUTIONS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED AFTER MARCH 22, 2010.

STATE OF NEVADA HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

Listed below are Nevada's requirements for all cattle entering Nevada for shows and/or sales. Cattle will be denied entry if these regulations are not met.

1. HEALTH CERTIFICATES (CERTIFICATE OF VETERINARY INSPECTION):
 - a. All cattle shall have a certificate issued by their private veterinarian and an entry permit number issued by this office prior to entry. (See #5)
 - b. Each animal must be individually identified on the certificate by either USDA metal eartag, registration ear tattoo or registration firebrand. All vaccinations and/or test results and dates are to be recorded on the certificate.
2. BRUCELLOSIS VACCINATION:
 - a. All females 4 months of age and older must be official brucellosis calfhood vaccinates with legible ear tattoo....No Exceptions! The vaccination tattoo symbol or vaccination date must be on the certificate. (Not "OV" or "OCV")
 - b. Females brucellosis vaccinated over 12 months of age (adult vaccinated) are denied entry.
3. BRUCELLOSIS and TB TEST REQUIREMENTS: (For cattle originating in non-accredited states)
 - a. No TB test required for beef cattle originating from free states. Cattle originating from Modified Accredited Advanced States: All beef breeding cattle 24 months and older must have a TB test within 60 days of entry. Cattle for exhibition must have a TB test within 60 days of entry. Cattle originating from Modified Accredited States: All dairy and beef cattle 6 months of age and older must have a TB test within 30 days of entry.
 - b. In addition to the brucellosis vaccination requirement, all females of the beef breeds 24 months of age and older shall be negative to an official brucellosis test within 30 days prior to entry.
 - c. Bulls 18 months of age and older shall be negative to an official brucellosis test within 30 days prior to entry.
 - d. Tests are to be performed in a state/federal approved laboratory and results obtained prior to obtaining an entry permit. The test date and results with the name and address of the laboratory shall be indicated on the certificate. Neither field tests nor "pending" test results will be honored.
 - e. If upon testing, a suspect/titered animal is disclosed, you may NOT pull that animal out of the shipment nor substitute with another animal...all cattle must remain in the state of origin until an evaluation of the herd health status is made and final decision of their eligibility is made by Nevada State Officials.
 - f. CATTLE FROM CERTIFIED BRUCELLOSIS FREE HERDS and STATES ARE EXEMPT FROM BRUCELLOSIS TEST REQUIREMENTS but not from the vaccination requirement. The herd certification number and the date of last herd test shall appear on the certificate.
4. All consignments must be free of lice, ringworm and scabies, and have a certificate attesting to the general good health of the animals, freedom from communicable diseases, etc., in addition to the brucellosis test.
5. ENTRY PERMIT NUMBER
After review and compliance with the above requirements, the consignor's veterinarian is authorized to use the following blanket permit number exclusively for the Angus Show/Sale: Permit **AB 121-109-7271**. Permit should be issued no more than 15 days prior to entry. The permit number must be on all copies of the certificate along with the name of the event, dates, and exact location. (Nevada Health & Vet Office: (775) 688-1180)
6. Cattle entering USA from Canada are normally required to be tuberculosis and brucellosis tested and be accompanied by a current health certificate. Female cattle will have to comply with Nevada's brucellosis vaccination requirements. Since international animal health import requirements are subject to change, the consignor's veterinarian should contact (301) 436-8383 for the latest update.
